BRIEF PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

About the College

The college had been established in 1999, propelled by the need for an institution of higher learning in the area. The philanthropic contributions of local residents and educationists enabled the construction of a one storey edifice. This humble beginning has eventually led to the development of separate multi-storeyed buildings for office, academic and residential purposes. In the initial years, it was guided by Dr. Ramchandra Mondal as a Teacher-in-Charge till Dr. Asim Kumar Manna took over as the Principal in January, 2001. Under his leadership, the college has blossomed into a proficient workshop of man-making. It has not only fostered the study of humanities but also diversified into science subjects like Aquaculture, Zoology, Botany and Anthropology. It has focused on a holistic view of education and hence has fruitfully nurtured departments of Music and Physical Education. The College has developed an active Vocational section, teaching courses on Computer, Electronics and Healthcare. It has also contributed in grooming the youth as patriotic citizens and has consistently engendered participants for the National Cadet Corps and the National Service Scheme.

Location

Far from the madding crowd of urban life, the college stands amidst a pastoral setting of azure sky, green paddy fields, comforting breeze and vibrant flowers of myriad colours. The Portuguese sailors first came to the area in 1514 and named their settlement as 'Angelim.' In 1765, the British took over and eventually established their port and merchant-house. The first Post and Telegram Office of India was set up in Khejuri in 1852. Being adjacent to the Bay of Bengal, it developed as an important sea-port during the colonial times; the likes of Dwarkanath Tagore and Raja Rammohan Roy had ventured for England from it. Situated at the side of the metalled road that links Henria with Vidyapith North, the college is well connected with Kolkata, Digha, Contai, Medinipur town and other important places. It is tucked in the middle of Khejuri thana. Adjacent the college, there is a branch of State Bank of India and the local police out-station is nearby.

Academic Expansion

The College has been affiliated to Vidyasagar University since its inception in 1999. Besides vocational course in Agriculture, the initial subjects to be taught in the General Degree Course comprised of Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Education, History, Geography, Sociology. Later, Political Science was introduced, followed by Aquaculture Management, Anthropology, Botany and Zoology. From the present academic year, Defence Studies and N.S.S have been introduced as General subjects.

Vision

The college envisions to serve as a sanctum of higher education for the students from the coastal rural areas of Purba Medinipur district, especially those from under-developed background (primarily, Scheduled Castes).

Mission

The College aims to provide a favourable ambience to inculcate qualities and develop abilities amidst students from marginalized sections of our society so that they may contribute fruitfully to Nation Building.

Objectives

- The college aims at providing holistic education, leading to the development of integrated individuals.
- The college endeavours to foster a sense of social responsibility, discipline and tolerance among the students.
- Keeping in view the objectives of higher education of the nation, the college tries to promote gender equality and ensure eradication of discrimination against women and marginalised gender identities.
- About sixty percent of students of the college belong to SC/ ST communities and many belong to B.P.L. households. Taking into consideration their need, the college wants to provide education which would prepare the students for the job market and thus wants to upgrade and update its infrastructure continually.
- The college also spreads awareness about ecological changes and challenges and encourages ecological preservation.

LIBRARY FACILITIES

The College has well-stocked library having books, periodicals, magazines & newspapers. The library is fully furnished with wide range of reference books on the subjects taught. Students may borrow books from the library against cards. Moreover, they can utilise the reading room facilities. Students must follow the existing rules of library. At present, about 8015 books and numerous periodicals/ journals in the library. Besides, the Department of Bengali has a Departmental Library comprising of about 400 books. The College Library is about to be digitalized. This would facilitate the students as it would provide an easier access to books and academic documents.

EXTENSION AND SUPPORT FACILITIES

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

College Hours

- The College commences at 10.00 am and closes at 5.00 pm, except on Saturday at 2.30 pm.
- Classes commence at 10.30 am and closes at 4.30pm, except on Saturday at 2.30 pm.
- Each class is of 01 hour duration.
- Cash Counter remains open upto 04 pm.

Academic Calendar

- There shall be three courses of studies leading to B.A./B.Sc. Degree and each course shall be of six semester duration. First shall be termed as B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.
- Honours Degree Course and second is B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. General Degree Course.
- Six semesters will be in three years.
- Odd semester (i.e. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester) is from July to December and even semester (i.e. 2nd, 4th and 6th semester) is from January to June.
- A candidate shall have to clear all the Semesters within consecutive five years from the academic year of his/her first admission to the college failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

Rules regarding Attendance

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examination subject to the fulfillment of other conditions as laid down in the regulations. Such attendance will be calculated from the date of first appearance of the classes of the student. The attendance of the students will be evaluated and marked as per the CBCS system.
- Students having less than 60 percent attendance will not be allowed to appear for Internal Assessment Examinations.

STUDENTS' UNION

The College has a democratically elected Students' Union which maintains a cordial relation between the students and the administration. Critical inputs are welcomed from the students and at the same time it is ensured that no working days are lost due to student unrest. Students' Union promotes various cultural programmes, athletic competitions etc. throughout the year and also publishes the annual college magazine, Bartika, under guidance the various professors.



ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Khejuri College Alumni Association was established in the year 2002. They arrange seminars, symposiums on various topics for the welfare of the college as well as for the students.
